

**A Church-Based Curriculum Designed to
Teach Entire Sanctification to New Believers
in Metro Praise International's Discipleship
Program**

SUMMARY OF THE PROJECT

- **PROBLEM TO SOLVE:** Neglecting to teach new believers entire sanctification at Metro Praise International (MPI) church has resulted in Christians lacking understanding in their new identity in Christ.
- **QUESTION TO ANSWER:** What effect does an effective curriculum being taught on entire sanctification have on the lives of the congregation at MPI church?
- **PROPOSED SOLUTION:** Design and teach a curriculum that would teach new Christians at MPI church the doctrine of entire sanctification in hopes that their understanding of the subject would increase and thereby have positive results in their Christian life.
- **METHOD FOR SOLVING THE PROBLEM:** Host a six-week online class where the curriculum is taught by the researcher to a selected number of new believers from MPI (less than 2 years saved). Along side of the class encourage the students to keep a prayer journal and stay accountable to reading their Bible.
- **EVALUATION & RESULTS:** The class had 13 new believers complete the class and follow the researcher's instructions. A mix method approach was used before and after the class to collect data. A ten-question Likert Scale Survey was given, along with a three-question short answer questionnaire. The same Likert Survey and questionnaire was given at the beginning and end of the class. The results were an overall increase of 8% in the Likert scale and significant indications of increased understanding of entire sanctification derived from the data in the post questionnaires. Both of these results helped confirm the thesis for the project, that teaching new believers entire sanctification does have positive results in the Christian experience.

MAJOR LITERATURE CONSULTED


- **CIRICULUM STRUCTURE SOURCE:** *A Well-Furnished Heart: Restoring the Spirit's Place in the Leadership Classroom*, by J. T. Flynn, W. L. Tjong, and R. W. West was used to derive the five core values of renewal-oriented theological training; summarized as biblical revelation, spiritual growth, church interaction, communal fellowship, and Spirit-empowerment. The research applied these main points into the curriculum by basing each of the six lessons on biblical revelation (vast usage of Scripture), aimed at spiritual growth, in cooperation with the student's church involvement, accountability sessions, and personal reliance on the Holy Spirit.
- **NON-PENTECOSTAL SOURCE FOR FORMING THE DOCTRINE OF ENTIRE SANCTIFICATION:** *Plain Account on Christian Perfection* by John Wesley was key to shaping the researcher's perspective on the necessity of Christian perfection (i.e., "entire sanctification"). Though the curriculum differed with Wesley on the timing of entire sanctification in the believer's life, there was much agreement in the materials with Wesley regarding the emphasis of being perfect in Christ and that spiritual perfection is based in the perfect love for God and neighbor that comes from being given a new heart at rebirth.
- **PENTECOSTAL SOURCES FOR FORMING THE DOCTRINE OF ENTIRE SANCTIFICATION:** *Sanctification and The Finished Work of Calvary- It Makes Plain the Great Work of Redemption* by William Durham were the most useful documents for the researcher to frame his own personal doctrine of entire sanctification for the curriculum. In summary, the researcher, along with Durham, believes that sanctification is completed when a sinner is saved. Hence, salvation and sanctification are finished in the believer's life because of Christ's finished work on the cross.
- **NEUROSCIENCE AND IDENTITY-BASED LEARNING SOURCES FOR THE CIRRICULUM :** *You Are Not Your Brain*, by Drs. Jeffrey Schwartz and Rebecca Gladding and *Change Your Brain, Change Your Life* by Dr. Daniel Amen were helpful in guiding the author in adding to the material's faith confessions and beginning thoughts to ponder while writing out a prayer journal because they support the revolutionary concept of "neuroplasticity." This confirms with Paul's command to renew the mind in Romans 12:1-2.

MAJOR BIBLICAL POINTS

- **EZEKIEL 36:25-27 (NIV), “25 I WILL SPRINKLE CLEAN WATER ON YOU, AND YOU WILL BE CLEAN; I WILL CLEANSE YOU FROM ALL YOUR IMPURITIES AND FROM ALL YOUR IDOLS. 26 I WILL GIVE YOU A NEW HEART AND PUT A NEW SPIRIT IN YOU; I WILL REMOVE FROM YOU YOUR HEART OF STONE AND GIVE YOU A HEART OF FLESH”**: God spoke through Ezekiel that in the New Covenant he was going to remove all their impurities (i.e., “sins) by giving His people a new spirit and heart. The researcher believes this was fulfilled at the new birth according to Jesus’ Words in John 3:3, to be “born again.”
- **MATTHEW 5:48 (NIV), “BE PERFECT, THEREFORE, AS YOUR HEAVENLY FATHER IS PERFECT”**: Jesus gave a direction command for all his followers to be morally perfect like their Heavenly Father. This kind of moral perfection made visible in the act of forgiving one’s enemies is not possible unless Christ’s disciples are first made perfect in their nature. This confirms Peter’s application of God’s command to His people to be Holy, like He is holy (Lev. 19:2 & 1 Pet. 1:16). As a result, only those who first have been made holy and perfect at spiritual rebirth can be holy and perfect like God the Father in all they do.
- **HEBREWS 10:14 (KJV), “FOR BY ONE OFFERING HE HATH PERFECTED FOREVER THEM THAT ARE SANCTIFIED”**: The author of Hebrews notes that it is by the one offering of Jesus that perfection is given to the sanctified. Thus, both perfection and sanctification are forever secured from the moment a person applies the offering of Jesus to their life by faith.
- **1 THESSALONIANS 4:3 (KJV), “FOR THIS IS THE WILL OF GOD, EVEN YOUR SANCTIFICATION”**: Paul makes it clear that sanctification is not a thing to be hoped for in the future after death because the sinful body of flesh is removed, but rather it is the will of God for people in this life.
- **1 CORINTHIANS 6:11 (NIV), “AND THAT IS WHAT SOME OF YOU WERE. BUT YOU WERE WASHED, YOU WERE SANCTIFIED, YOU WERE JUSTIFIED IN THE NAME OF THE LORD JESUS CHRIST AND BY THE SPIRIT OF OUR GOD”**: Paul taught the believers that when they were justified, they were also washed and sanctified. To the same extent that sin was removed from the Christian’s record before God at salvation (justification) so was their sin removed from their nature (sanctification).

MAJOR THEOLOGICAL POINTS

BEFORE CHRIST



AFTER CHRIST






THE SPIRIT

The spiritual soul (mind, will, & emotions) reborn and created in righteousness and holiness by the Holy Spirit.

THE FLESH

The physical body influenced by the brain and the five senses (touch, taste, see, hear, & smell).



Galatians 5:24-25, "24 Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. 25 Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit."

MAJOR HISTORICAL POINTS

- **JOHN WESLEY & THE METHODIST MOVEMENT:** John Wesley, along with those who followed his teachings of Christian Perfection (Asbury, Clark, etc.) did a great job initially of passing down the love for God understanding of entire sanctification and holiness, along with a strong urge to make disciples who live in accountability as they serve in the church. However, over time, those in the Methodist movement that did not embrace the teachings of the Pentecostal movement in the early 1900's soon became a causality in the war of liberalism. Sadly, many modern Methodists do not carry the same fervor as the early Methodists once did for holiness.
- **THE HOLINESS-PENTECOSTAL TRADITION:** In the early 1900's it is of no surprise that God poured out His blessing of Pentecost on the very ones who were passionate for holiness. These holiness preachers like William Seymour, leader of the Azusa Street Revival, were the perfect fodder for God to bring fresh fire upon. Sadly, like with the many of the Methodists before them, a certain number of the first Pentecostals like Seymour were not willing to adjust their understanding of sanctification as it became clear that the baptism of the Holy Spirit was not given for sanctification but for power (as seen in Acts 1-2).
- **THE FINISHED WORK DOCTRINE OF WILLIAM DURHAM:** Thankfully, God used Brother Durham to more adequately define the doctrine of entire sanctification and the baptism of the Holy Spirit. He insisted, rightly so from Scripture, that in fact sanctification occurred at the same time of salvation, not at the baptism of the Holy Spirit. One can clearly see that in Acts 1-2 there is not one mention of holiness regarding the Father's Promise, nor is being from sin an evidence that the Holy Spirit had been poured out. Therefore, it is clear to see that instead of a three-step process (salvation, then sanctification, and then the baptism of the Holy Spirit)- God was revealing a two-step process (salvation/sanctification and then the baptism of the Holy Spirit).
- **A REASON OFFERED TO WHY MANY MODERN DAY PENTECOSTALS FALL SHORT IN REGARD TO ENTIRE SANCTIFICATION:** In short, it is the belief of the researcher that because the Pentecostals, like those on the Assembly of God, lost the desire for entire sanctification, they have become more similar in their beliefs to the other Christian traditions that their ancestors fought so hard to break away from.



- RESULTS FROM THE SHORT ANSWER QUESTIONNAIRE**

1. MPI's new believers are very well versed in key doctrinal and lifestyle expectations for those who hold to entire sanctification.
2. Training people to understand such controversial subjects like Christian perfection are not beneath comprehension of new believers.
3. Though MPI church could count the materials and class as a success from the post-class questionnaire, its success is not able to be assessed on its own merits because the church has a unique culture built upon the doctrine of entire sanctification.
